

There are a number of activities regarding mental health in the month of October. October 7-13 is *Mental Illness Awareness Week* nationally. That is the time when many churches and supporting entities educate about mental illness. Removing the stigma is a key part of that effort. Despite mental illnesses' prevalence, stigma and misunderstanding are also widespread. That is why St. Francis is actively working to decrease that stigma. Someone has said, "Normal' is a setting on a washing machine." How true.

October 9th there is a candlelight service for Mental Illness Recovery and Understanding at Reid Park, Cancer Survivors Plaza, from 6:00 - 7:00 pm. Speakers will tell their stories about how mental illness affected them and describe their paths to recovery. Arizona is promoting the theme of "Cure Stigma" throughout all awareness events.

Oct 10th The Loft Theater will be showing a film on suicide, called "S" Word, at 7:00 pm. This documentary tells stories of suicide attempt survivors and of family members who have lost loved ones to suicide.



preserve the voices of America that were being lost. In 1933, Lomax traveled outside his experience, tradition, and comfort zone, to the Parchman Farm State Penitentiary in Mississippi to listen to Walter McDonald sing this amazing African-American ballad.

Listening is such an important spiritual attribute.

In the politics of the current moment, we are asking each other important questions about what voice our country will hear and follow. Will it be the comforting, but unattainable, voice of what is somewhere behind us on the railroad tracks of time, or will we listen to the more challenging voice that calls us toward a future that we may not yet understand, but toward which the Divine is certainly calling us?

Each Saturday evening, starting at 4:30, we will have a lecture series, "A Conspiracy of Hope" which is free and open to everyone. Please come, but even more importantly, please invite others to join the conversation; those you agree with easily as well as those who offer you more challenging voices.

Our Bishop, Bob Hoshibata, is hoping we will be willing to speak truth to each other (and listen to one another) so that we can climb onto the train that will lead us toward the Church that should be present for ALL of us. We need strong voices and listening ears from St. Francis at this event.

St. Francis donates their space and helps transform the Community Center into a colorful "restaurant" where Chef John and his team of volunteers prepare amazing meals for over 100 people.

Preparations for POZ Café happen on several levels: since each attendee (or Care Partner) receives a "gift" bag filled with essentials such as toilet paper, paper towels, toothbrushes, razors, shaving cream and more, it is the responsibility of each participating faith community to collect these items in large numbers when it is their turn.
